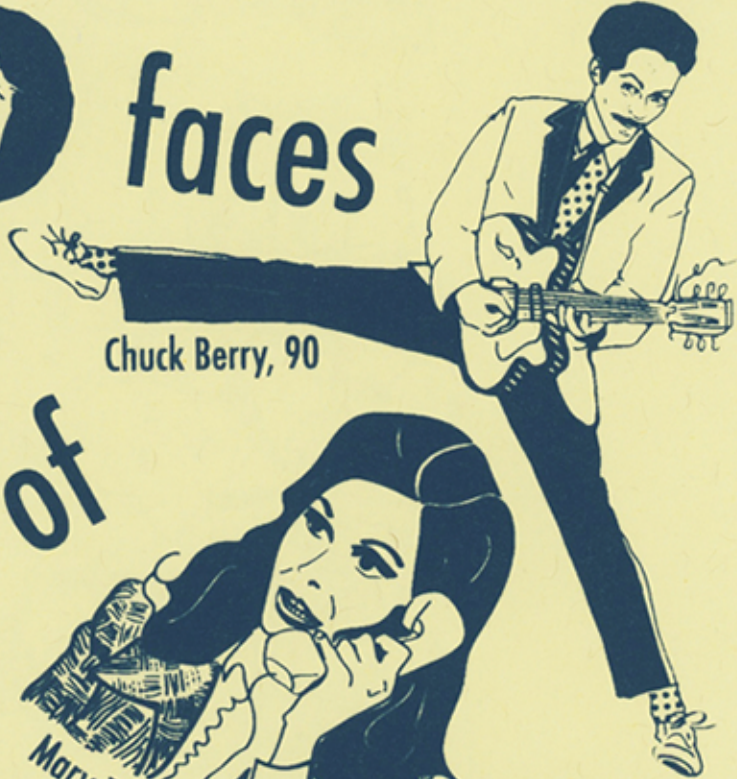

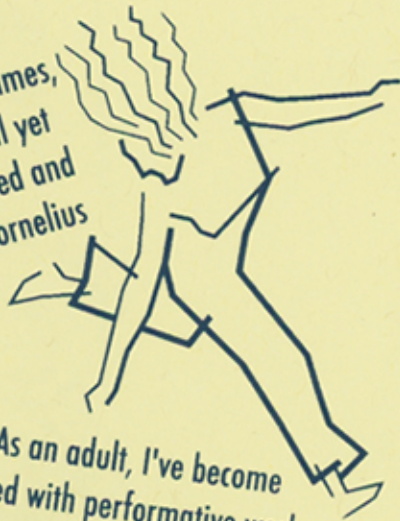

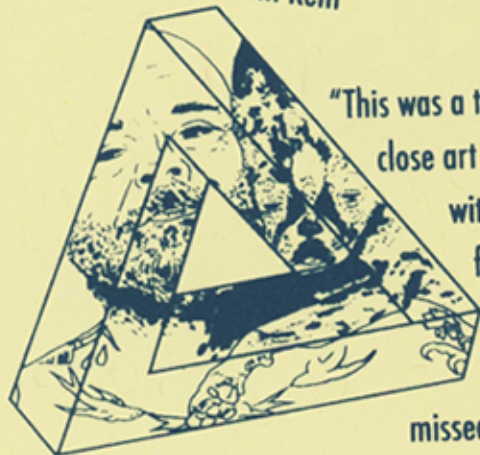


Why have there been no great women artists?
